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Special notes on LCD monitors

The following are normal with the LCD monitor and do not indicate a problem.

- Due to the nature of the fluorescent light, the screen may flicker during initial use. Turn off the power switch and then turn it on again to make sure the flicker disappears.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- The LCD screen has 99.99% or more effective pixels. It may include blemishes of 0.01% or less such as a missing pixel or a pixel lit all the time.
- Due to the nature of the LCD screen, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image, when the same image is displayed for hours.
 In this case, the screen is recovered slowly by changing the image or turning off the power switch for a few hours.

Read these instructions carefully. Keep this document for future reference. Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.

Cleaning your monitor

Please carefully follow these guidelines when cleaning the monitor:

- Always unplug the monitor before cleaning.
- Use a soft cloth to wipe the screen and cabinet front and sides.

Connecting/disconnecting the device

Observe the following guidelines when connecting and disconnecting power from the LCD monitor:

- Make sure the monitor is attached to its base before connecting the power cord to the AC power outlet.
- Make sure both the LCD monitor and the computer are turned off before connecting any cable or unplugging the power cord.
- If the system has multiple sources of power, disconnect power from the system by unplugging all power cords from the power supplies.

Accessibility

Be sure that the power outlet you plug the power cord into is easily accessible and located as close to the equipment operator as possible. When you need to disconnect power from the equipment, be sure to unplug the power cord from the electrical outlet.

Safe listening

To protect your hearing, follow these instructions.

- Gradually increase the volume until you can hear it clearly and comfortably and without distortion.
- After setting the volume level, do not increase it after your ears have adjusted.
- Limit the amount of time listening to music at high volume.
- Avoid turning up the volume to block out noisy surroundings.
- Turn the volume down if you can't hear people speaking near you.

Warnings

- Do not use this product near water.

Taking care of your vision

Long viewing hours, wearing incorrect glasses or contact lenses, glare, excessive room lighting, poorly focused screens, very small typefaces and low-contrast displays could stress your eyes. The following sections provide suggestions on how to reduce eyestrain.

Eves

- Rest your eyes frequently.
- Give your eyes regular breaks by looking away from the monitor and focusing on a distant point.
- Blink frequently to keep your eyes from drying out.

Display

- Keep your display clean.
- Keep your head at a higher level than the top edge of the display so your eyes point downward when looking at the middle of the display.
- Adjust the display brightness and/or contrast to a comfortable level for enhanced text readability and graphics clarity.
- Eliminate glare and reflections by:
 - placing your display in such a way that the side faces the window or any light source
 - minimizing room light by using drapes, shades or blinds
 - using a task light

- changing the display's viewing angle
- using a glare-reduction filter
- using a display visor, such as a piece of cardboard extended from the display's top front edge

Avoid adjusting your display to an awkward viewing angle.

Avoid looking at bright light sources, such as open windows, for extended periods of time.

Develop the following work habits to make your computer use more relaxing and productive:


- Take short breaks regularly and often.

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
Unpacking

Please check that the following items are present when you unpack the box, and save the packing materials in case you need to ship or transport the monitor in the future.



Attaching/Removing the base

- 1. Remove the monitor from the package.
- 2. Fasten the captive screw on the base to secure the base to the stand.
- 3. Place the monitor face down on a flat and stable surface covered by a protective sheet and then install the stand with 2 screws to secure the monitor.
- 4. Reverse the steps when you want to remove the base.



FreeSync Premium (HDMI/DP only)

It allows a FreeSync Premium supported graphics source to dynamically adjust display refresh rate based on typical content frame rates for power efficient, virtually stutter free and low-latency display update.

Adjusting the viewing angle

To optimize the viewing experience, you can adjust the tilt or height of the monitor by holding the left and right sides of the monitor. The tilt can be adjusted to a 15-degree angle upwards or a 5-degree angle downwards.





Connecting the power cord

- Check first to make sure that the power cord you use is the correct type required for your area.
- The monitor has a universal power supply that allows operation in either 100/120 V AC or 220/240 V AC voltage area. No user-adjustment is required.
- Plug one end of the power cord to the AC inlet, and plug the other end into an AC outlet.
- For units using 120 V AC:
 Use a plug rated 10 A/125 V.
- For units using 220/240 V AC:
 Use a plug rated 10 A/250 V. The cord set should have the appropriate safety approvals for the country in which the equipment will be installed.

Power saving

The monitor will be switched to "power saving" mode by the control signal from the display controller, as indicated by the red power LED.

Mode	LED light
On	Blue
Power saving	Amber

The power saving mode will be kept until a control signal has been detected or the keyboard or mouse is activated. The recovery time from "power saving" mode back to "on" is around 3 seconds (Auto Source off).

Display Data Channel (DDC)

To make installation easier, so long as your system supports the DDC protocol, the monitor is able to plug-and-play. The DDC is a communication protocol through which the monitor automatically informs the host system about its capabilities; for example, supported resolutions and corresponding timing. The monitor supports the DDC2B standard.



Installation


Connecting Your Monitor to a Computer

 Connect the HDMI cable and/or DP cable to your computer according to your applications.



Note: Both the HDMI cable and DP cable are optional.

- 2. Connect the power adapter to the DC-in port on the monitor.
- 3. Connect the power cord to the power adapter.
- 4. Fully insert the power cord plug into the power outlet socket.






Note: If you want to move the monitor, hold the left and right sides of the monitor. Lifting up the monitor by holding its base may damage the monitor.

Joystick

The monitor features a small joystick located on the bottom-left side of the rear panel. The joystick can be used to navigate the OSD menu and confirm selections as well as functions as the power button.



Using the joystick



Turning on/off the monitor:

- When the monitor is off, press the joystick to turn on the monitor.
- When the monitor is turned on, press and hold the joystick for about 5 seconds to turn off the monitor.

Configuring the monitor:

- Press the joystick to open the OSD menu.
- Toggle the joystick up/down/left/right to navigate the OSD menu.
- Press the joystick to confirm selections.
- Toggle the joystick left/right to adjust settings.
- Press the joystick to confirm changes.

On Screen Display (OSD) Menu



Note: The following content is for general reference only. Actual product specifications may vary.

The OSD (On Screen Display) menu can be used to adjust the monitor's settings. You can use the joystick on the rear panel of the monitor to access and navigate the OSD menu.

- 1. Press the joystick to open the OSD menu.
- 2. Toggle the joystick up/down/left/right to navigate the OSD menu.
- 3. Press the joystick to confirm selections.
- 4. Toggle the joystick left/right to adjust settings.
- 5. Press the joystick to confirm changes.



Hot key 1 (default: Standard mode)

Select **Mode** to view more setting options. The options include: **Action**, **Racing**, **Sports**, **User**, **Standard**, **ECO**, **Graphics**, and **HDR**.



Hot key 2 (default: Brightness)

Select **Brightness** and then adjust the brightness of the monitor.

Input source

Select **Input** to view more setting options. The options include: **HDMI1**, **HDMI2**, **DP1**, **DP2**, and **Auto Source**.



Main OSD menu

The main OSD menu lists all setting options that allow users to make adjustments to the display. To open the main OSD menu, select **Menu** in the OSD portal.

Adjusting the Picture settings



The setting options include:

- **Brightness**: Adjusts the brightness of the monitor (0 to 100).
- Contrast: Adjusts the contrast of the monitor (0 to 100).



Note: Contrast sets the degree of difference between light and dark areas.

• **Black Boost**: Adjusts the black level of the monitor to make details in shaded areas more visible (0 to 10).

Blue Light: Filters out blue light to protect your eyes (Off / 80% / 70% / 60% / 50%).



Note: The higher the value is, the more blue light passes through.

- ACM: Enables/Disables the Adaptive Contrast Management function (Off / On).
- HDR: Sets the High Dynamic Range function (Off / Auto).



Note: When HDR is set to Auto:


- If the input source content is in SDR, the brightness of the monitor is configurable. If the input source content is in HDR, the brightness of the monitor will be fixed at 100 and grayed-out.
- ACM, Gamma, Contrast, Blue Light, Color Temp., Black Boost, Grayscale Mode, 6-axis Hue, and 6-axis Saturate will be grayed-out and cannot be configured.
- 3. **Gamma** and **Color Temp.** on the **Color** sub-menu will be hidden.
- Super Sharpness: Enables/Disables the Super Sharpness function (Off / On).
 This technology can simulate high-resolution images by enhancing the pixel density in videos and images.
- Max Brightness: Default is Off.



Note: Due to environmental considerations, the default brightness of the display will be low. It can be adjusted to your preference with the following steps:

- Step 1: Go to OSD menu > **Picture** > **Max Brightness**, and turn Off to On to increase the brightness.
- Step 2: When Max Brightness is turned on, adjust Brightness value between 0 and 100 to your preference.

Adjusting the Color settings





The setting options include:

- Gamma: Adjusts the mid-tone contrast of the monitor (1.8 / 2.0 / 2.2 / 2.4 / 2.6).
- Color Temp.: Adjusts the color temperature of the monitor (Cool / Normal / Warm / User / Blue Light).
- **R/G/B Gain**: Adjusts R/G/B gain of the monitor (0 to 100).
- R/G/B Bias: Adjusts R/G/B bias of the monitor (0 to 100).
- Modes: Open the Modes menu.
- Color Space: Sets the color space of the monitor (sRGB / Rec. 709 / HDR / EBU / DCI / SMPTE-C / Standard).



Note:

- When Color Space is set to HDR, Modes will be automatically set to HDR.
- If Color Space is not set to HDR, Modes will be automatically set to Standard.
- Grayscale Mode: Enables/Disables the grayscale mode (Off / On).
- **6-axis Hue**: Adjusts the hue of red, green, blue, yellow, magenta or cyan.
- **6-axis Saturate**: Adjusts the saturation of red, green, blue, yellow, magenta or cyan.

Adjusting the Audio settings



The setting options include:

- **Volume**: Adjusts the volume of the internal speakers (0 to 100).
- Mute: Turns on/off the sound (Off / On)

Adjusting the Gaming settings



The setting options include:

• Over Drive: Configures the monitor to make the pixels transition colors faster (Off / Normal / Extreme).



Note:

- If FreeSync Premium is set to On, Over Drive will be set to Normal automatically.
- If FreeSync Premium is set to Off, users can set Over Drive to any one of the setting options: Off, Normal, or Extreme.
- **FreeSync Premium**: Enables/Disables the FreeSync Premium technology which is only supported by AMD's graphic cards (**Off** / **On**).
- Refresh rate num: Displays the monitor's refresh rate (Off / On).



Note: When **FreeSync Premium** is set to **On**, the monitor's refresh rate will be displayed on the screen.

 VRB: To choose whether to support dynamic picture more clean control, default is Off.



Note:

- 1. HDR setting: "Auto" is not support VRB.
- VRB set " Normal or Extreme ", when to turn on FreeSync Premium, will auto set VRB is "Off".
- 3. VRB set "Normal or Extreme", when to adjustment (Brightness, Blue Light, ACM), will auto set VRB is "Off".
- 4. VRB function does not affect the (Logo, Aim Point, Message and Input Icon) brightness.

- 5. VRB setting "Normal or Extreme ", when detection of Input Timing <75Hz, will auto off the VRB and gray out to disable.
- VRB = (Normal or Extreme), because the IC control dynamic picture is cleaner, so the overall Brightness will be dark, "Extreme" will be darker than "Normal".
- Aim point: Displays the aim point on the screen of the monitor (Off / Icon1 / Icon2 / Icon3).

Adjusting the OSD settings



The setting options include:

- Language: Changes the OSD menu language.
- **OSD timeout**: Sets the number of seconds the OSD menu is displayed before it automatically closes (10 to 120 seconds).
- Transparency: Sets the transparency of the OSD menu when using the Gaming mode (Off / 20% / 40% / 60% / 80%).
- OSD Lock: Disables/Enables the joystick (Off / On).



Note: To unlock the joystick, toggle the joystick right and hold it for about three seconds.

Adjusting the System settings



The setting options include:

- Input: Selects the input source (HDMI1 / HDMI2 / DP1 / DP2).
- Auto Source: Enables/Disables the monitor to automatically search for available input sources (Off / On).



Note: If you need to configure BIOS, it is recommended to turn Auto Source to Off and select Input to the correct corresponding input source.


- Wide Mode: Adjusts the aspect ratio of the monitor (Full / Aspect / 1:1)
- **Hot Key Assignment**: Assigns the function that the hot keys on the OSD portal will access.
 - Hot Key 1 (Modes / Brightness / Volume / Gamma / Contrast / Blue Light / Over Drive / VRB)
 - Hot Key 2 (Modes / Brightness / Volume / Gamma / Contrast / Blue Light / Over Drive / VRB)
- **DDC/CI**: Enables/Disables you to configure the monitor using software installed on your computer (**Off / On**).



Note: DDC/CI stands for Display Data Channel/Command Interface. It enables users to send commands to adjust the monitor's configurations.

- **HDMI Black Level**: Adjusts the black level range of an HDMI input source (**Normal / Low**).
- Quick Start Mode: Speeds up the monitor's boot-up process (Off / On).

Information



The setting options include:

- Reset All Settings: Resets the OSD menu to its default settings.
- Exit: Exits the OSD menu.

Save Settings to... (for User Mode only)



The **Save Settings to...** option will appear when the monitor is set to the **User** mode. It allows you to set up three different game modes for your preference.
