

# Care & Cleaning

- When the same image is displayed for hours, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image. The screen will recover slowly or you can turn off the Power Switch for hours.
- When the screen becomes black or flashes, or cannot work anymore, contact your dealer or service center to fix it. Do not repair the screen by yourself!




- If any of the above items is damaged or missing, contact your retailer immediately.
- Select "ON" when you see the message "LIGHT IN MOTION ON/OFF" appears if you want to turn on the red light on the base. Select "OFF" if you want it to turn off. If you disable this function but later wish to reactivate it, please use the OSD menu to turn it on.
- If no signal is detected for around 12 minutes, the monitor automatically enters saving mode.

# 1.3 Assembling the Monitor Arm/Base




- While assembling the monitor arm/base, we recommend that you keep the monitor inside its EPS (Expanded Polystyrene) packaging.
- 1. Align the screw hole on the arm with the bundled screw on the base. Then insert the base into the arm.
- 2. Fix the base to the arm by fastening the bundled screw.
- 3. Align the triangle marks on the monitor base and the LED projection cover. Then attach the LED projection cover to the monitor base.
- 4. Remove the monitor from its EPS packaging.



# 1.5 Monitor Introduction

## 1.5.1 Using the Control Buttons

Use the control buttons on the side of the monitor to adjust the image settings. Press key 1-5 to activate the key list page.



### 1. $\equiv$ ( $\bigcirc$ 5-way) Button:

- Turn on the OSD menu. Enact the selected OSD menu item.
- Increase/Decrease values or moves your selection up/down/ left/right.

#### Close Button:

- Exit the OSD menu.
- Turn on the OSD menu when the monitor enters standby mode or display the "NO SIGNAL" message.

#### 3 GamePlus Button:

- Activate Crosshair, Timer, FPS Counter, or Display Alignment function.
- Move the  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) button up/down to select and press  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) to confirm the function needed.
- Turn on the OSD menu when the monitor enters standby mode or display the "NO SIGNAL" message.

#### 4. G GameVisual Button:

- Press this hotkey to switch from eight video preset modes (Scenery Mode, Racing Mode, Cinema Mode, RTS/RPG Mode, FPS Mode, sRGB, MOBA Mode, and User Mode) with GameVisual ™ Video Intelligence Technology.
- Turn on the OSD menu when the monitor enters standby mode or display the "NO SIGNAL" message.

#### 5. **(b)** Power Button:

Press this button to turn the monitor on/off.

#### 1.5.2 GamePlus Function


The GamePlus function provides a toolkit and creates a better gaming environment for users when playing different types of games. The crosshair overlay with four different crosshair options lets you choose the one that best suits the game you are playing. There is also an onscreen timer you can position on the left of the display so you can keep track of the elapsed gaming time; while the FPS (frames per second) counter lets you know how smooth the game is running. Display Alignment displays alignment lines on 4 sides of the screen, serving as an easy and handy tool for you to line up multiple monitors perfectly.

#### To active GamePlus:

- Press the GamePlus hotkey.
- 2. Move the  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) button up/down to select among different functions.
- 3. Press the  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) button or move the  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) button right to confirm the function you choose, and move the  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) button up/down to navigate through the settings. Move the  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) button left to go back, off, or exit.

4. Highlight the desired setting and press the **■** (**⊘**) button to activate it. Press the **X** button to inactivate it.

#### 1.5.3 GameVisual Function

To active GameVisual:

- Scenery Mode: This is the best choice for scenery photo displaying with GameVisual™ Video intelligence Technology.
- Racing Mode: This is the best choice for racing game playing with GameVisual™ Video intelligence Technology.
- Cinema Mode: This is the best choice for movie watching with GameVisual™ Video intelligence Technology.
- RTS/RPG Mode: This is the best choice for Real-Time Strategy (RTS)/ Role-Playing Game (RPG) playing with GameVisual™ Video intelligence Technology.
- **FPS Mode**: This is the best choice for First Person Shooter game playing with GameVisual™ Video intelligence Technology.
- sRGB Mode: This is the best choice for viewing photos and graphics from PCs.


# 2.1 Detaching the Stand (for VESA Wall Mount)



 Avoid damaging the monitor surface. While detaching the monitor stand, always keep the monitor inside its EPS packaging.

The detachable stand of this monitor is specially designed for VESA wall mount.

- 1. Disconnect power and signal cables. Carefully put the monitor facedown on its EPS packaging.
- 2. Remove the covers on where the monitor and the arm meet.
- 3. Remove the four (4) screws securing the arm to the rear of the monitor.
- 4. Detach the stand (arm and base) from the monitor.





- The VESA wall mount kit (100 x 100 mm) is purchased separately.
- Use only the UL Listed Wall Mount Bracket with minimum weight/load 22.7kg (Screw size: M4 x 15 mm).

# 2.2 Adjusting the Monitor

- For optimal viewing, we recommend that you look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor to the angle that is most comfortable for you.
- Hold the stand to prevent the monitor from falling while changing its angle.
- The recommended adjusting angle is +20° to -5° (for tilt)/+50° to -50° (for swiveling), and adjustable height is 100 mm.





• It is normal that the monitor slightly shakes while you adjust the viewing angle.

# 3.1 OSD (On-Screen Display) Menu

## 3.1.1 How to Reconfigure



- 1. Press the  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) button to activate the OSD menu.
- 2. Move the \(\equiv \bigo|\) button up/down to navigate through the functions. Highlight the desired function and press the \(\equiv \bigo|\) button to activate it. If the function selected has a sub-menu, move the \(\equiv \bigo|\) button up/down again to navigate through the sub-menu functions. Highlight the desired sub-menu function and press the \(\equiv \bigo|\) button or move the \(\equiv \bigo|\) button right to activate it.
- 3. Move the  $\equiv$  ( $\bigcirc$ ) button up/down to change the settings of the selected function.
- 4. To exit and save the OSD menu, press the X button or move the ≡ (்) button left repeatedly until the OSD menu disappears. To adjust other functions, repeat steps 1 to 3.

### 3.1.2 OSD Function Introduction


#### 1. GameVisual

This function contains eight sub-functions that you can select for your preference. For more information, please refer to page 1-7.



## 2. Blue Light Filter

Reduce the energy level of blue light emitted from LED backlight.



- Level 0: No change.
- Level 1~4: The higher the level, the more blue light will be reduced.



- When Blue Light Filter is activated, the default settings of Racing Mode will be automatically imported.
- · Between Level 1 to Level 3, the Brightness function is user-configurable.
- Level 4 is optimized setting. It is compliance with TUV Low Blue Light Certification. The Brightness function is not user-configurable.



Please refer to the following to alleviate eye strains:

- Users should take some time away from the display if working for long hours. It is advised to take short breaks (at least 5 mins) after around 1 hour of continuous working at the computer. Taking short and frequent breaks is more effective than a single longer break.
- To minimize eye strain and dryness in your eyes, users should rest the eye
  periodically by focusing on objects that are far away.
- Eye exercises can help to reduces eye strain. Repeat these exercises
  often. If eye strain continues please consult a physician. Eye exercises: (1)
  Repeating look up and down (2) Slowly roll your eyes (3) Move your eyes
  diagonal.
- High energy blue light may lead to eye strain and AMD (Age-Related Macular Degeneration). Blue light filter to reduce 70% (max.) harmful blue light to avoiding CVS (Computer Vision Syndrome).

#### 3. Color

Select the image color you like from this menu.



 Brightness: Adjust the brightness level. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.

- Contrast: Adjust the contrast level. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- **Saturation**: Adjust the saturation level. The adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Color Temp.: Select the desired color temperature. Available options: Cool, Normal, Warm, and User Mode.



- In the User Mode, colors of R (Red), G (Green), and B (Blue) are user-configurable; the adjusting range is from 0 to 100.
- Gamma: Allows you to set the color mode to 1.8, 2.2, or 2.5.

### 4. Image

You can set the image overdrive (OD) options, configure Aspect Control, ASCR, ELMB, and Adaptive-Sync from this menu.



- OD (Over Drive): Speeds up the response time by Over Drive technology. The adjusting range is from lower Level 0 to the fastest Level 5
- Aspect Control: Adjust the aspect ratio to Full and 4:3.



- 4:3 is only available when the input source is in 4:3 and 5:4 format.
- ASCR: Select ON or OFF to enable or disable dynamic contrast ratio function.
- **ELMB**: Check to decrease motion blur and minimize ghosting part when on-screen objects are fast-moving.




- If the Adaptive-Sync/FreeSync is enabled, the ELMB function is grayed out.
- Adaptive-Sync/FreeSync: Allows an Adaptive-Sync or FreeSync supported graphics source (HDMI and DisplayPort) to dynamically adjust display refresh rate based on typical content frame rates for power efficient, virtually stutter free and lowlatency display update.



If the Adaptive-Sync/FreeSync is enabled, the ELMB function is grayed out.



- Aura RGB: Set the Aura RGB light pattern on the rear of the monitor. Available options: Rainbow, Color Cycle, Static, Breathing, Strobing, and Off.




For Aura RGB patterns, such as Static, Breathing, and Strobing you can set your
