

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FOR YOUR SAFETY

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

WARNING

STOP OPERATING THE MONITOR IF YOU ARE AWARE OF ANY PROBLEMS

If you notice any abnormal phenomena such as smoke, strange sounds or fumes, unplug the monitor and contact your dealer or iiyama service center immediately. Further use may be dangerous and can cause fire or electric shock.

NEVER REMOVE THE CABINET

High voltage circuits are inside the monitor. Removing the cabinet may expose you to the danger of fire or electric shock.

DO NOT PUT ANY OBJECT INTO THE MONITOR

Do not put any solid objects or liquids such as water into the monitor. In case of an accident, unplug your monitor immediately and contact your dealer or iiyama service center. Using the monitor with any object inside may cause fire, electric shock or damage.

INSTALL THE MONITOR ON A FLAT, STABLE SURFACE

The monitor may cause an injury if it falls or is dropped.

DO NOT USE THE MONITOR NEAR WATER

Do not use where water may be splashed or spilt onto the monitor as it may cause fire or electric shock.

OPERATE UNDER THE SPECIFIED POWER SUPPLY

Be sure to operate the monitor only with the specified power supply. Use of an incorrect voltage will cause malfunction and may cause fire or electric shock.

PROTECT THE CABLES

Do not pull or bend the power cable and signal cable. Do not place the monitor or any other heavy objects on the cables. If damaged, the cables may cause fire or electric shock.

ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS

It is advisable not to operate the monitor during a heavy thunder storm as the continual breaks in power may cause malfunction. It is also advised not to touch the plug in these circumstances as it may cause electric shock.

CAUTION

INSTALLATION LOCATION

Do not install the monitor where sudden temperature changes may occur, or in humid, dusty or smoky areas as it may cause fire, electric shock or damage. You should also avoid areas where the sun shines directly on the monitor.

DO NOT PLACE THE MONITOR IN A HAZARDOUS POSITION

The monitor may topple and cause injury if not suitably located. Please also ensure that you do not place any heavy objects on the monitor, and that all cables are routed such that children may not pull the cables and possibly cause injury.

MAINTAIN GOOD VENTILATION

Ventilation slots are provided to keep the monitor from overheating. Covering the slots may cause fire. To allow adequate air circulation, place the monitor at least 10cm (or 4 inches) from any walls. When removing the tilt stand, the ventilation slots on the back side of the monitor can be blocked. This may overheat the monitor and may cause fire or damage. Make sure to allow enough ventilation when removing the tilt stand. Operating the monitor on its back, side, upside down or on a carpet or any other soft material may also cause damage.

DISCONNECT THE CABLES WHEN YOU MOVE THE MONITOR

When you move the monitor, turn off the power switch, unplug the monitor and be sure the signal cable is disconnected. If you do not disconnect them, it may cause fire or electric shock.

UNPLUG THE MONITOR

If the monitor is not in use for a long period of time it is recommended that it is left unplugged to avoid accidents.

HOLD THE PLUG WHEN DISCONNECTING

To disconnect the power cable or signal cable, always pull it by the plug. Never pull on the cable itself as this may cause fire or electric shock.

DO NOT TOUCH THE PLUG WITH WET HANDS

Pulling or inserting the plug with wet hands may cause electric shock.

WHEN YOU INSTALL THE MONITOR ON YOUR COMPUTER

Be sure the computer is strong enough to hold the weight of the monitor, otherwise, you may damage your computer.

CAREFUL! PROTECT YOUR HANDS AND FINGERS

- Be careful not to hurt your fingers or hands when you change the height or the angle.
- Injury can occur if care is not taken to avoid finger contact with the displays base when adjusting the height.

REMARK FOR 24/7 USAGE

This product is not specifically designed for 24/7 usage in all environments.

REMARK SPECIFIC TO DESKTOP USE

This product is designed for desktop use, not for digital signage (electronic signboard) applications such as ceiling hanging or wall mounting as wall mounting.

OTHERS

ERGONOMIC RECOMMENDATIONS

To eliminate eye fatigue, do not operate the monitor against a bright background or in a dark room. For optimal viewing comfort, the monitor should be just below eye level and 40-60cm (16-24 inches) away from your eyes. When using the monitor over a prolonged time, a ten minute break every hour is recommended as looking at the screen continuously can cause eye strain.

SPECIAL NOTES ON LCD MONITORS

The following symptoms are normal with LCD monitors and do not indicate a problem.

NOTE

- When you first turn on the LCD monitor, the picture may not fit in the display area because of the type of computer that is used. In this case, adjust the picture position to the correct position.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern
- Due to the nature of the LCD screen, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image, when the same image is displayed for hours. In this case, the screen can be recovered slowly by changing the image or turning off the Power Switch for some hours.

■ If you have to return your unit for service and the original packaging has been discarded, please contact your dealer or iiyama service center for advice or replacement packaging.

CLEANING

WARNING

■ If you drop any materials or liquids such as water into the monitor when cleaning, unplug the power cable immediately and contact your dealer or iiyama service center.

CAUTION

■ For safety reasons, turn off the power switch and unplug the monitor before you clean it.

NOTE

- To protect the LCD panel, do not scratch or rub the screen with a hard object.
- Never use any of the following strong solvents. These will damage the cabinet and the LCD screen.

Thinner Spray-type cleaner

Benzine Wax

Abrasive cleaner Acid or Alkaline solvent

■ Touching the cabinet with any product made from rubber or plastic for a long time may cause degeneration or loss of paint on the cabinet.

CABINET

Stains can be removed with a cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solvent. Then wipe the cabinet with a soft dry cloth.

LCD

Periodic cleaning with a soft dry cloth is recommended.

SCREEN

Don't use tissue paper etc. because these will damage the LCD screen.


- This product is designed for desktop use, not for digital signage (electronic signboard) applications such as ceiling hanging or wall mounting.

[DISPLAY ARM OR DESK ARM STAND]


CAUTION

■ When you use with the display arm or desk arm stand, in consideration of thickness of the mounting stage, tighten the M4 Screws (4pcs) which "L" length is 12mm to fasten the monitor. Using the screw longer than this may cause electric shock or damage because it may contact with the electrical parts inside the monitor.



[LANDSCAPE MODE]

This monitor can only be used in landscape. Do not rotate or operate the monitor in any other orientation than landscape.




FITTING AND REMOVAL OF STAND


- CAUTION Put the monitor on a stable surface. The monitor may cause injury or damage if it falls or is dropped.
 - Do not give a strong impact to the monitor. It may cause damage.
 - Unplug the monitor before removal or installation to avoid an electric shock or a damage.

<Installation>


1 Place the carton box on a flat surface as shown below. Take out the Stand-Neck and Stand-Base from the upper protecting cushion inside the carton box.




2 Open the bag containing the monitor.




③ Install the Stand-Neck to the monitor in the lower protecting cushion.



④ Install the Stand-Base to the Stand-Neck and then tighten the thumb screw to secure it.




⑤ Carefully take out the assembled monitor from the protecting cushion and stand it up.




<Removal>


- ① Put the monitor protecting cushion on a flat surface and place the monitor face down in it.
- (2) Press the release button in the direction of the arrow as shown below to remove the stand.



3 Loosen the thumb screw to disassemble the stand.


CONNECTING YOUR MONITOR

- 1 Ensure that both the computer and the monitor are switched off.
- ② Connect the computer to the monitor with the signal cable.
- 3 Connect the computer to the monitor with the USB Cable (A-B).
- ④ Connect the computer to the monitor with the USB Cable (C-C) when viewing images on your monitor through the USB Type-C Connector or when using the monitor's USB hub function.*
- ⑤ Connect the Power Cable to the monitor first and then to the power source.
- 6 Turn on your monitor and computer.
- * When charging connected device via USB Type-C Connector, check if the device is equipped with a USB Type-C Connector that supports charging function via USB PD (=Power Delivery).
 - Turn on the "USB BC" function to allow connected device to be charged even when the monitor is in standby mode. See page 22 for USB Battery Charge (USB BC) function.
 - The USB power delivery is up to 90W. If the connected device required more than 90W for operation or for boot up (when the battery is drained), use the original power adapter that came with the device.
 - If a separately purchased USB Type-C Cable is used, make sure the cable is certified by USB-IF and is full-featured with power delivery and video / audio / data transfer functions.
 - If the monitor is in standby mode, it will not display a picture automatically in the following situations:
 1. First boot of the PC
 2. When the PC is resuming from standby mode
 To display a picture, press the Navigation Button BACK. This behaviour is normal. To prevent this behaviour, please access the OSD menu and set "USB BC" to "ON".
 - USB cable (A-C) is not included with the monitor. If you use a USB cable (A-C), please note that
 you can only transfer data.
 - Compatibility with all connected devices is not guaranteed due to different user environments.

NOTE


- Make sure that the building installation has a circuit breaker of 120/240V, 20A (maximum).
- The signal cables used for connecting the computer and monitor may vary with the type of computer used. An incorrect connection may cause serious damage to both the monitor and the computer. The cable supplied with the monitor is for a standard connector. If a special cable is required please contact your local iiyama dealer or regional iiyama office.
- The Class I pluggable equipment Type A must be connected to protective earth.
- The socket-outlet shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible.
- Excessive sound pressure from ear-/headphones can cause hearing damage/hearing loss.





ADJUSTING THE HEIGHT AND THE VIEWING ANGLE

- For optimal viewing it is recommended to position yourself directly opposite to the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor's height and angle to your own preference.
- Hold the panel so that the monitor does not topple when you change the monitor's height or angle.
- You are able to adjust the monitor's height up to 130mm, the angle up to 20° upward and 3° downward.

- NOTE Do not touch the LCD screen when you change the height or the angle. It may cause damage or break the LCD screen.
 - Careful attention is required not to pinch your fingers or hands into the moving part of the stand when you change the angle.
 - Injury can occur if care is not taken to avoid finger contact with the displays base when adjusting the height.






OPERATING THE MONITOR

NAVIGATION BUTTON

Press the following 5 places on the Navigation Button to move in each direction or make direct adjustments on the on-screen menu.

To create the best picture, your iiyama LCD monitor has been preset at the factory with the COMPLIANT TIMING shown on page 30. You are also able to adjust the picture by following the operation shown below.

① Press the Navigation Button CENTER to start the On-Screen Display (OSD) feature. There are additional Menu items which can be switched by pressing the Navigation Button LEFT⊲ / ▷ RIGHT.



- Select the Menu item which contains the adjustment icon relating to the adjustment you want to make and press CENTER. Then, press the Navigation Button FRONT / BACK to highlight the desired adjustment icon.
- ③ Press CENTER again. Press LEFT⊲ / ▷ RIGHT to make the appropriate adjustment or setting.
- ④ Press CENTER and then press LEFT

 √ to leave the menu, so that the settings you just made would be automatically saved.

For example, to correct for OSD vertical position, select Menu item of "OSD Settings" and press CENTER. Then, select "OSD V. Position" by pressing FRONT / BACK and press CENTER. Press LEFT / PRIGHT to change the OSD vertical position settings. The OSD vertical position should be changing accordingly while you are doing this.



Press **CENTER** and then press **LEFT** dastly to close the On-Screen Display feature. All changes are saved in the memory.



- When button operations are aborted during adjustment, On-Screen Display disappears when the time set for the "OSD Time Out" has passed. Also, the Navigation Button LEFT can be used to return previous menu and turn off the On-Screen Display.
- Any changes are automatically saved in the memory when the On-Screen Display disappears. Turning off the power should be avoided while using the Menu.
