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# **Special notes on LCD monitors**

The following are normal with the LCD monitor and do not indicate a problem.

- Due to the nature of the fluorescent light, the screen may flicker during initial
  use. Turn off the power switch and then turn it on again to make sure the flicker
  disappears.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- The LCD screen has 99.99% or more effective pixels. It may include blemishes of 0.01% or less such as a missing pixel or a pixel lit all the time.
- Due to the nature of the LCD screen, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image, when the same image is displayed for hours. In this case, the screen is recovered slowly by changing the image or turning off the power switch for a few hours.

# Safety instructions

Read these instructions carefully. Keep this document for future reference. Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.

### Cleaning your monitor

Please carefully follow these guidelines when cleaning the monitor:

- Always unplug the monitor before cleaning.
- Use a soft cloth to wipe the screen and cabinet front and sides.

# Connecting/disconnecting the device

Observe the following guidelines when connecting and disconnecting power from the LCD monitor:

- Make sure the monitor is attached to its base before connecting the power cord to the AC power outlet.
- Make sure both the LCD monitor and the computer are turned off before connecting any cable or unplugging the power cord.
- If the system has multiple sources of power, disconnect power from the system by unplugging all power cords from the power supplies.

# Accessibility

Be sure that the power outlet you plug the power cord into is easily accessible and located as close to the equipment operator as possible. When you need to disconnect power from the equipment, be sure to unplug the power cord from the electrical outlet.

# Safe listening

To protect your hearing, follow these instructions.

- Gradually increase the volume until you can hear it clearly and comfortably and without distortion.
- After setting the volume level, do not increase it after your ears have adjusted.
- Limit the amount of time listening to music at high volume.
- Avoid turning up the volume to block out noisy surroundings.
- Turn the volume down if you can't hear people speaking near you.


### Warnings

- Do not use this product near water.

# **Product servicing**

# Tips and information for comfortable use

#### Eyes

#### Display

- Keep your head at a higher level than the top edge of the display so your eyes point downward when looking at the middle of the display.

- · Eliminate glare and reflections by:
  - placing your display in such a way that the side faces the window or any light source

- minimizing room light by using drapes, shades or blinds
- using a task light
- changing the display's viewing angle
- using a glare-reduction filter
- using a display visor, such as a piece of cardboard extended from the display's top front edge
- Avoid adjusting your display to an awkward viewing angle.
- Avoid looking at bright light sources, such as open windows, for extended periods
  of time.

- Take short breaks regularly and often.
- Perform some stretching exercises.
- Breathe fresh air as often as possible.
- Exercise regularly and maintain a healthy body.

# Attaching/ Removing the base



Note: Remove the monitor and monitor base from its packaging. Carefully place the monitor face-down on a stable surface -- use a cloth to avoid scratching the screen.



- 1. Attach the base to the monitor, as illustrated.
- 2. Ensure that the base is screwed tight onto the monitor stand arm.

# Screen position adjustment

To optimize the viewving position, you can adjust the monitor tilt by using both of your hands to hold the edges of the monitor as shown below. The monitor can be adjusted to 20 degrees up or 5 degrees down.



# Connecting the Power cord

- Check first to make sure that the power cord you use is the correct type required for your area.
- The monitor has a universal power supply that allows operation in either 100/120 V AC or 220/240 V AC voltage area. No user-adjustment is required.
- Plug one end of the power cord to the AC inlet, and plug the other end into an AC outlet.
- For units using 120 V AC:
   Use a UL-listed cord set, type SVT wire and plug rated 10 A/125 V.
- For units using 220/240 V AC:
   Use a cord set consisting of H05VV-F cord and plug rated 10 A/250 V. The cord set should have the appropriate safety approvals for the country in which the equipment will be installed.

# Power saving

The monitor will be switched to "power saving" mode by the control signal from the display controller, as indicated by the amber-colored power LED.



The power saving mode will be kept until a control signal has been detected or the keyboard or mouse is activated. The recovery time from "power saving" mode back to "on" is around 3 seconds.

# Display Data Channel (DDC)


To make installation easier, so long as your system supports the DDC protocol, the monitor is able to plug-and-play. The DDC is a communication protocol through which the monitor automatically informs the host system about its capabilities; for example, supported resolutions and corresponding timing. The monitor supports the DDC2B standard.

# Installation


To install the monitor on your host system, please follow the steps below:

#### Steps

- 1 Connect the video cable
  - a Make sure both the monitor and computer are switched off.
  - b Connect the VGA video cable to the computer.
  - c Connect the HDMI Cable (Optional, only HDMI-Input Model)
    - (1) Make sure both the monitor and computer are powered-OFF .
    - (2) Connect the HDMI cable to the computer.
- 2 Connect the power cord


Connect the power cord to the monitor, then to a properly grounded AC outlet.


- 3 Turn on the monitor and computer
  Turn on the monitor first, then the computer. This sequence is very important.
- 4 If the monitor does not function properly, please refer to the troubleshooting section to diagnose the problem.



In order to prevent damage to the monitor, do not lift the monitor by its base.

### Main Page



- 1. Main menu
- 2. Input Switch
- 3. Volume
- 4. Mode


#### Turn Mode on or off

Open the Mode control and turn Mode on or off using the adjustment arrows (OFF/ON), and select which profile to use (Please see the OSD section for more information).



# **Adjusting the Volume**

Open the Volume control and set the volume using the arrows. When you are done, use \to go back one level.





Note: Adjustment of the volume control as well as the equalizer to other settings than the center position may increase the ear/headphone output voltage and therefore the sound pressure level.

### Selecting the Input

Open the input control and select VGA or HDMI. When you are done, use to go back one level.



# The Function page

Open the Function page to select Picture, Color, Audio, OSD or System functions, and adjust the settings which you want using the arrows. You can also view your monitor's system information from this page. When you are done, use 

to go back one level.

### Adjusting the Picture





- Press the MENU key to bring up the OSD.
- 2. Using the ▲/▼ keys, select Picture from the OSD. Then navigate to the picture element you wish to adjust.
- 3. Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  keys to adjust the sliding scales.
- 4. The Picture menu can be used to adjust the Brightness, Contrast, Black Boost, Blue Light, ACM, H.Position, V.Position, Focus and Clock.
- 5. Brightness: Adjust the brightness from 0 to 100.
  - ➂

Note: Adjusts the balance between light and dark shades.

- 6. Contrast: adjust the contrast from 0 to 100.
  - Note: Sets the degree of difference between light and dark areas.
- 7. Black Boost: This boosts the amplitude of the dark color levels of the display– blacks will be less black. The higher the level, the higher the boost.

8. Blue Light: filter out blue light by adjusting different Blue Light showing ratio - 80%, 70%, 60%, 50%.



Note: Higher values allow more blue light through. For the best protection, select a lower value.

9. ACM: Turn ACM on or off. The default is off.


### Adjusting the Color






- 1. Press the MENU key to open the OSD.
- 2. Using the ▲/▼ keys, select Color from the OSD. Then navigate to the picture element you wish to adjust.
- 3. Use the  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  keys to adjust the sliding scales.
- 4. Gamma mode allows you to adjust the luminance tone. The default value is 2.2 (standard value for Windows).
- 5. Color temperature: Default is warm. You can choose Cool, Warm, Bluelight or User.
- 6. 6-axis Hue: Adjust the red, green, blue, yellow, magenta and cyan hue.
- 7. 6-axis Saturate: Adjust the red, green, blue, yellow, magenta and cyan saturation.

### Adjusting the Audio




- 1. Press the MENU key to open the OSD.
- 2. Using the ▲/▼ keys, select Audio from the OSD. Then navigate to the picture element you wish to adjust.
- 3. Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  keys to adjust the sliding scales.
- 4. Volume: Adjusts the volume.

### Adjusting the OSD




- 1. Press the MENU key to open the OSD.
- 2. Using the ▲/▼ keys, select OSD from the OSD. Then navigate to the setting you wish to change.
- 3. Use the ▲/▼ keys to adjust any sliding scales.
- 4. Language: Set the OSD menu language.
- 5. OSD Timeout: Adjust the delay before turning the off the OSD menu.
- 6. Transparency: Select the transparency when using gaming mode. The transparency can be 0% (OFF), 20%, 40%, 60%, or 80%.

### **Adjusting the System**



- 1. The System menu can be used to select settings such as Input, Auto source, Wide Mode, Hot Key Assignment, DDC/CI, HDMI Black level and Quick Start Mode.
- 2. Press the MENU key to open the OSD.
- 3. Using the ▲/▼ keys, select System from the OSD. Then navigate to the setting you wish to adjust.
- 4. Use the ▲/▼ keys to select the setting.
- 5. Input: Select the source from VGA or HDMI.
- 6. Auto Source: Automatically searches for available input sources.
- 7. Wide Mode: You can select which screen aspect you are using. The options are Full, Aspect and 1:1.
- 8. Hot Key Assignment: Select the function of Hot Key 1 or Hot Key 2.
- 9. DDC/CI: Allows the monitor settings to be set through the software on the PC.
  - Note: DDC/CI, short for Display Data Channel/Command Interface, which allows monitor controls to be sent via software.
- 10. HDMI Black Level: You can select the level of blackness under HDMI source. The options are Normal and Low.
- 11. Quick Start Mode: Enable monitor rapidly.

### **Product information**



- 1. Press the MENU key to open the OSD.
- 2. Using the ▼/▲ keys, select Information to view the basic information for your monitor and current input.
- 3. Reset: Resets all settings to the factory defaults.
